



Scam Aware

It has happened since I have been here that people have received emails or texts from me usually asking for gift cards.

These scammers have gotten fairly sophisticated and can fake things pretty well.

One thing I will never do is ask you for gift cards via email or text. So if they are asking for gift cards whether from me or someone else it is very likely a scam.

Also so far I have not been hacked in my phone or my email. I'm not saying that it cannot happen, but this is not the general way that scammers are working today.

So for instance, the scam from this past weekend, the telephone number area code was from Georgia. This of course is not my phone. So that is always one thing you can look at to see if the area code makes sense.

On emails they will have my name as the sender but when you look at the email address it can often have other names in it. So make sure the email address fits mine.

Also anyone in a hurry or anyone who says "don't try to call me" or "I need this right now" is most likely scamming.

I thank the person from this past weekend because they were willing to send me gift cards for children who were sick. But of course, the gift cards would not have gone to the intended recipient.

Interested in social, racial, and economic justice? Here is an opportunity to act. Get involved in a [Safe Spaces Issue Team sponsored by Isaiah](#). Isaiah is a multi-racial, state-wide, non-partisan coalition of faith communities fighting for racial and economic justice in Minnesota. As part of its work on racial, social and economic justice, known as the Safe Spaces Initiative in the St. Cloud area, ISIAH is building two small issue leadership teams: one for housing equity and one for education equity. These teams will meet a handful of times and will work together on developing a framework for action on equity in each issue area. They will dig into the data on disparities, talk to experts in the community, and research possible actions that would improve equity. They will share what they learn in the Spring with others who are a part of Safe Spaces and with their faith communities. Church of the Week Program February 21-25, 2022

Our ACC cluster will be participating in the Place of Hope's Church of the Week program to provide food and shelter for the homeless of our community the week of February 21-25, 2022.

Due to Covid protocols the program is different this year. Here is how you can help:

1.) We need volunteers to prepare and serve meals for 175 people at the Place of Hope each evening. The food can no longer be cooked at home and brought in as new requirements require the food to be prepared in a Food Licensed Service Kitchen. Therefore, we need to have a group of 3-10 people each evening that can have a meal ready to serve at 4:45 PM. Cooking may start at the Place of Hope at 2:00 PM and includes clean-up so you should be finished by 6:30 PM.

2.) The Place of Hope is housing the homeless in their facilities. If you would like to volunteer as an overnight monitor, please contact the Place of Hope at 320-203-7881.

3.) Monetary donations will also be accepted. Please place your monetary donation in an envelope in the collection basket and mark it Church of the Week.


