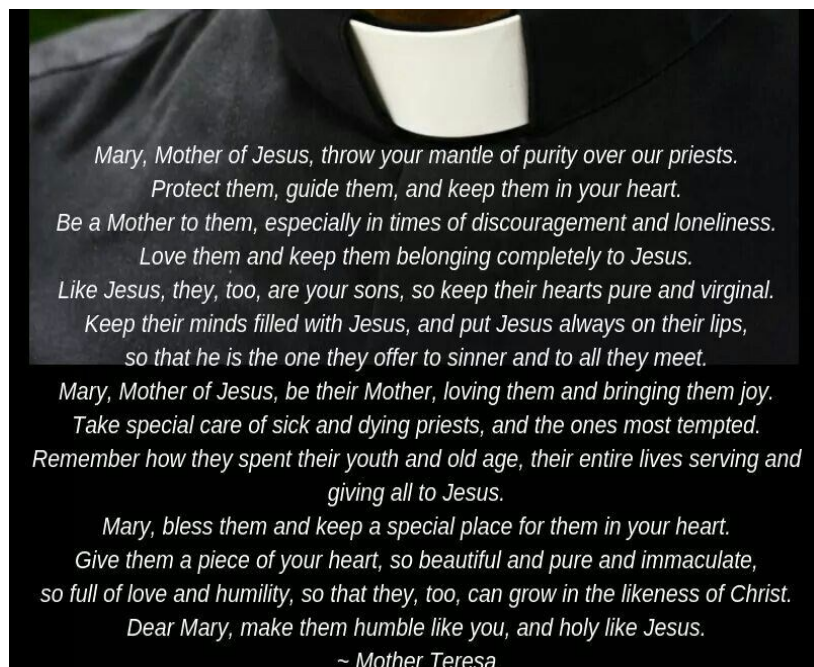

Halloween

The word *Halloween* or *Hallowe'en* dates to about 170 AD and is of Christian origin. The word "Halloween" means "hallowed evening" or "holy evening". It comes from a Scottish term for *All Hallows' Eve* (the evening before All Hallows' Day). So, this day is the Eve of something like Christmas Eve is the Eve of Christmas. It is an anticipation of a great day. So, what is the great day?

It is what we have come to call All Saints Day. This day we remember the great vision of the book of Revelation: After this I had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation comes from our God, who is seated on the throne, and from the Lamb... Then one of the elders spoke up and said to me, "Who are these wearing white robes, and where did they come from?" I said to him, "My lord, you are the one who knows." He said to me, "These are the ones who have survived the time of great distress; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. (Rev 7:9-10, 13-14). This vision of the multitude dressed in white is part of why in baptism we receive the white garment and then at the funeral the white pall is placed over the casket. We are clothed and dressed in the power of Jesus Christ.

This celebration of heaven has an eve that is Halloween. Part of the lore of this night is that those who know Christ have overcome their fears. We are not afraid of scary things in this world because Christ has the victory over all sin and death. So scary pumpkins, clowns

and darkness do not control those who have come to know the Lord. So, as we celebrate the Eve of All Saints this year let us not forget the day. The day where we share with John the vision of the multitude dressed in white and place our hope in Jesus and his way to inherit eternal life. To celebrate All Saints Day, we have a 4:30 mass at Saint Anthony on Monday, an 8:00 AM mass at Holy Spirit and a 6:30 PM mass at Newman.
