

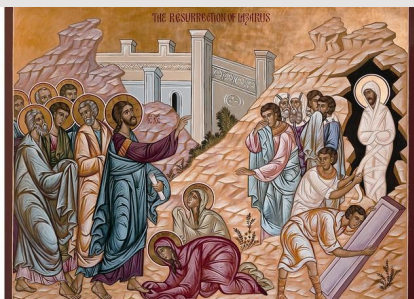

## **Peace Be With You**

(Thank you, Fr. Mark, for the opportunity to share a few words as a member of Holy Spirit. Roxann Storms, MSW, LICSW, FT)

In the upcoming week, we will hear readings containing an array of emotions: from the exultant Hosanna of Palm Sunday to ordinary days of routine to the affection in the breaking of bread as companions sit at the table of the Lord. There will be the denial on Good Friday stemming from fear and then the depth of sorrow standing at the foot of the cross. Even Jesus will feel agony and ask his Father to take away what lays ahead before he comes into acceptance of the path laid out for him, well aware of the suffering that lay ahead. There will be tiredness of body and spirit. We know the joy of Easter morning, but for the original disciples, news of the empty tomb must have been confusing and scary.

The wide range of emotions depicted in Holy Week might have been with some of us in these past months, and actually several years, of change. As Fr. Joe came into our parishes, initially at Newman Center to bring a sense of safety following a deeply distressing time, and then to St. Anthony and Holy Spirit upon the reassignment of a beloved pastor, he brought his own unique gifts of pastoral care, humbleness, and humor. He made a mark on our lives and parishes, and his absence has been a loss. His leave, and now request for a fresh start upon his return, can have us feeling like the disciples who locked themselves away in the Upper Room: confused, anxious, and afraid of what's to come. In weariness of change, some might feel like they've had enough and are ready to find a different parish. Others might have a "let's wait and see" attitude, while others might be just fine or even find themselves growing deeper in their faith. At Holy Spirit, and I'm sure at Newman Center and St. Anthony's, there have been inspiring examples of folks being Christ to each other through smiles or handshakes, helping at a parish function, lighting a candle, and just showing up in person or in prayer. These are the things that bind us together as vibrant communities of faith.

We are still in uncertainty, but we are not abandoned. Fr. Mark, Fr. John Paul and our beloved retired priests continue to link us to Jesus through the sacraments, while we ourselves continue to extend the hands and heart of Christ to each other. Like the disciples, we will experience the Alleluia of Easter; our journey through this extended "Lenten season of our spirits" in these next few months will be fortified with the hope that comes from the Resurrection. There will be ordinary days sprinkled with times of companionship and moments of joyful celebration. There will be times of confusion and doubt, laughter, frustration and calm – the array of the human experience. When questions and trepidation arise, when we feel like the disciples in the Upper Room, forsaken and alone, we need to just remember the beautiful vision of Jesus, Christ the Lord, appearing in their midst saying, to them and to us, "Peace be with you; my peace I give you. I am with you always."

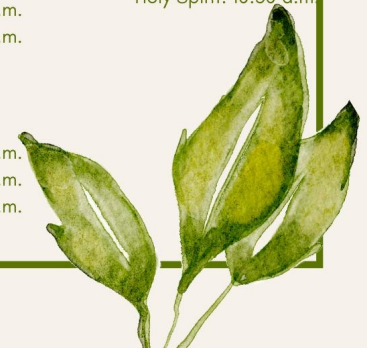
