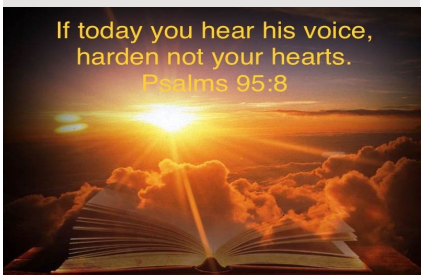

The series continues on Sun, March 19th, following the 9:15 am liturgy, with a look at ways in which youth and adult transitional housing programs address these issues, presented by Suzie Rice, program supervisor of such programs for Catholic Charities.

Accompanying Youth in the Work of Racial Justice

Join us in the Terrace, Sunday, March 26, following the 9:15 am liturgy, for a presentation and conversation with Dr. Michelle Lelwica, religion professor at Concordia College (Moorhead). She will share what she's learning from her work with incarcerated youth. Specifically, she will talk about what the youth she visits are teaching her about her own privileges, and sharing compassion, accountability, and healing. She'll discuss different theological narratives that have impacted Americans' understanding of justice. The conversation will have practical applications for faith communities' broader work for racial justice.
