Keeping Our Eyes on Jesus

This weekend's Gospel is about Jesus healing a blind man, but also working with those, who spiritually, could not see Christ, the Son of God, in Jesus. I encourage us to keep praying for Fr. Joe, as he is more and more enlightened spiritually.

Many people been asking me how I am handling two full-time positions? The only way I can put this request that Bishop Kettler and now Bishop Patrick have for me in perspective, is to look at it as a retreat. From the very beginning of November, I had to see this as a retreat. I have and continue to encourage you to look at this time as a retreat as well. When I heard the news that Fr. Joe was not coming back, my heart sank, but I knew what needed to be done. So, when Bishop Patrick asked me to continue through July 1, I thought, I am not ordained a priest for Mark Stang, I am ordained for the Church, for the people of God. He must trust me. I do question God, "Who am I, a simple farm boy from St. Nicholas, to lead this many people, spiritually, through this time? God, you have the wrong person." However, I trust the Holy Spirit is working. I need to be a vessel. I see this time has moved from a retreat to a pilgrimage. I will give it my best to be present to you and trust that the Holy Spirit will guide us on this journey through Lent, into the Easter Season, and beyond.

To be honest with you, I do get overwhelmed at times with trying to please everyone. When I take my eyes off of Jesus, I sink. Jesus always pulls me up and says, "O Mark, you of little faith." I am blessed to have Fr. John Paul as Sacramental Minister at Christ Church Newman Center, and the retired priests helping with Masses at St. Anthony's and Holy Spirit parishes.

In all three parishes, the Staff and Trustees are very good to work with. They are being extra diligent in looking at the future, seeing how best to make it as easy as possible for the Pastor. With that, I feel confident that we can hand this assignment over to the next Pastor in very good shape. I will certainly be praying for you and doing all that I can as we journey together on this pilgrimage. I know God knows what we are going through, and God is so close to us. In the hospital, I deal with trauma and tragedies and know God has called me to minister to the sick and suffering there.

As we journey on this pilgrimage, I thank those who have given already, and I am going to continue to ask you to acknowledge and come forth with your gifts. I do not see any changes happening until July. In fact, I see a sense of calm and I pray for healing in our future. I want to be sensitive to the feelings you are having now, thus, in next week's bulletin, I have asked a parishioner, who has a professional perspective, to speak to our emotions and feelings.

Let us not be blinded to the working of the Holy Spirit like those that Jesus confronted but let us keep our eyes on Jesus.
