### Holy Week

During our morning meditations, we will be going through each day of the Easter Triduum to talk about the instruction of the Church and the readings for each day. These meditations can be found on Holy Spirit and Newman Facebook pages as well as Christ Church Newman Center YouTube channel. This hopefully will give us a backdrop to enter into Palm Sunday (already recorded) Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter (Vigil and Sunday). One of my seminary instructors said "On Holy Thursday Jesus does not give us a talk about what the meaning is. He gives us an act of worship—it is through the worship that we discover more and more deeply the meaning". So while we read the instructions they really only prepare us to worship the living God in these upcoming mysteries.

This is the introduction to the Easter celebrations in the Roman Missal.

1) In the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday thru Easter Sunday), the church solemnly celebrates the greatest mysteries of our redemption, keeping by means of special celebrations the memorial of her Lord, crucified, buried and risen.

The Paschal Fast should also be kept sacred. It is to be celebrated everywhere on the Friday of the Lord's Passion and where appropriate prolonged also through Holy Saturday as a way of coming, with spirit uplifted, to the joys of the Lord's Resurrection.

2) For a fitting celebration of the Sacred Triduum, a sufficient number of lay ministers is required, who must be carefully instructed as to what they are to do.

Singing is of great importance to this celebration. When texts are sung they have their proper impact. Pastors should not fail to explain to the faithful, as best they can, the meaning and order of the celebrations and to prepare them for active and fruitful participation.

3) The celebrations of the Sacred Triduum are to be carried out only in those churches in which they can be done with dignity, that is, with good attendance of the faithful, an appropriate number of ministers, and the means to sing at least some of the parts.

Many interesting things here. The importance of singing to the celebration. Lay people (that is people who aren't priests and deacons) are necessary for the celebration. Crowds are important. Pastors are to take time to help explain the mysteries. In what will become the future of celebrations in our three parishes and has already happened in the past two of the parishes will gather together for Holy Saturday (this year Holy Spirit and Newman) these collaborations will continue in the future and it is an exciting to worship together!
